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# Abertillery Foundry Gateway

### Key themes: Prosperous Communities & Learning Communities

A landmark part of the £13million regeneration programme for Abertillery will be the Foundry Bridge Gateway. Inspired by local collieries and interpreted by local schoolchildren, the Foundry Gateway Project consists of a series of six spires with burning embers, which will represent the industrial past and provide a gateway to the commercial centre of the town.



Pupils from Abertillery Comprehensive School, Abertillery Primary School, Bryngwyn Primary School, Rose Heyworth Millennium School and St Illtyd's Primary School all took part in a competition for the Foundry Gateway Project in collaboration with Communities First.

The pupils were invited to design pictures and poems which capture their views of local industrial heritage. The 16 winning pieces will be engraved onto A3 stainless steel plaques and displayed on the wall adjacent to the spires. To inspire their designs, pupils were taken on trips to Big Pit National Mining Museum and took part in an art workshop facilitated by artist Becky Adams. Some pupils also visited the Guardian memorial and the former sites of their local collieries - Cwmtillery Colliery, Penybont and Grey Collieries, Rose Heyworth Colliery, Six Bells Colliery and Vivian Colliery.


The project has allowed children to make connections with their parents and grandparents memories of the past, which will promoted a sense of local ownership of the Foundry Gateway Project between younger and older generations.

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# Abertillery Work Club

Key themes: Prosperous Communities & Learning Communities



Abertillery Work Club is a collaborative approach between a number of organisations, including Communities First, Careers Wales, BG Adult Education and Want 2 Work.

It exists to provide a one-to-one service, offering a wider scale of support to improve people's employability, confidence and to move them closer to the job market.

The service is a voluntary one for jobseekers, offered informally at Abertillery Library on a Wednesday morning from 9.30-12.30am. People can drop-in for a cup of tea and coffee and get the help they need. This can involve careers guidance interviews, help with writing or updating a CV, setting-up an e-mail address and help with internet job search, basic IT training information about volunteering and how to access local training and education opportunities. For clients who are interested in setting-up their own business, we have helped to support them through the BG Effect project, giving them the help and support to develop their ideas.

Established with a small set-up grant from Job Centre Plus, Abertillery Work Club has helped over 130 people over the last 12 months. If you are unemployed or looking for a change of direction please drop in!

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# ASDAN Youth Achievement Awards

Key themes: Prosperous Communities, Healthier Communities & Learning Communities



Eleven pupils from Abertillery Comprehensive School used the community gardens to help with their ASDAN Youth Achievement Award. The awards take an activitybased approach to peer education, and encourage young people to take more responsibility in selecting planning and leading activities. They also help young people to enhance self-esteem, develop communication skills and resolve differences by negotiation, work well with others, develop values and plan ahead. The Bronze Youth Achievement Award is a 60 hour programme. The young people had to focus on a number of modules, including building an ecofriendly greenhouse from pop bottles, preparing soil and planting seasonal fruit and vegetables which they had researched and submitting a portfolio of work for external assessment.

Abertillery Comprehensive School pupils, Connor Long, Connor Price, Darian Dobbs, Ieuan Williams, Liam Andrews, Josh Williams and Robert Meek are the first seven young people in Blaenau Gwent to achieve Youth Achievement Award. Congratulations to them!

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# **Engineering Our Future**

### Pupils from Abertillery

Comprehensive School, Abertillery Primary School and Queen Street Primary School were involved in an engineering project, which saw them build a scale model of the second Severn crossing.



Construction Ambassadors helped the pupils with the tasks of assembling the bridge. They volunteered with the project and work in a variety of engineering roles.

The project, arranged by Abertillery Communities First involved The Institute of Civil Engineering and the companies Capita Symonds, Carillion and Construction Skills.

It helped to:

- encourage young people to explore civil engineering as a potential career;
- motivate young people, aiming to increase their results at Key Stage 2/3/4;
- help cut school absences in primary and comprehensive school.

Tracey Williams, from Abertillery Comprehensive School commented "the project has helped to explain to young people the different careers available in engineering, and to give them a taster of this. It has also been a wonderful transitional project for Abertillery Primary and Queen Street Primary, who worked with year 9 pupils, who used the experience to contribute towards their Welsh Baccalaureate".
